This will be my last newsletter for the term and what a busy term it has been with some significant milestones achieved. I hope that those of you who attended the Reception and Year One concerts enjoyed them as much as the children, who enjoyed learning the songs and performing for you. It was lovely to see so many of you at the crib service at St Peters Church. The children in Years Two, Three and Four sung well, and those who had roles to play whether playing the recorder, speaking or putting characters in the crib scene rose to the challenge.

Over the term the children have participated in many learning activities both in and out of the classroom. These have included all classes making soup as part of Harvest, supporting Shelterbox, undertaking an art project called Take One Picture in conjunction with the National Gallery, Moneysense programmes for Year Three, Children in Need and lots of activities around Sustainability week.
