### **Art and Design**

At Alban City School, we aim to teach Art and Design in a fun, creative, imaginative and engaging way. We will ensure that children are inspired and challenged throughout each topic, and develop the confidence to experiment and reflect their personalities in their artwork. We use the AccessArt Primary Art Curriculum which is designed around the idea that art is far more than a series of technical skills. The curriculum nurtures creative thinking skills and helps ensure children learn through art as well as about art. Each child will cover lots of different disciplines, techniques, materials and approaches and progression of knowledge and skills is woven throughout. Opportunities will be provided to develop deeper understanding and critical thinking by exploring the work of various artists, sculptors and designers, and their impact on culture and history.
