Promoting British Values at Alban City School

The Dfe requires schools to meet the requirements set out in section 78 of the Education Act 2002 and promote the spiritual, moral and cultural development of their pupils. Through ensuring pupil's SMSC development, schools can also demonstrate they are actively promoting fundamental British values.
