Welcome to the Autumn Term

We hope you find the following information useful.

In Year 5 our P.E is on Tuesday and swimming is on Friday.

Mr Clements and Mr Bushell will teach in Year 5 on Tuesday afternoons to cover planning, preparation and assessment time (PPA). Mr Clements will also teach in both classes on Friday mornings.

Reading books can be changed at any point during Soft Start throughout the week and all children are expected to read at least 3 times a week. This reading should be recorded in the reading record, stating the title and the page numbers read.

Parents/carers must sign the homework diaries before Friday each week. A member of staff will also sign the homework diaries on Fridays and check reading has been recorded.

Homework will be set on Friday using Google Classroom. Each week a Maths task will be set alongside another curriculum area. All homework set will be due in on the following Wednesday unless stated otherwise. Spellings will be handed out on a Friday and stuck into the homework diary and will then be tested the following Friday. These spellings will link to spelling rules taught at school. We are no longer using the Emile app.

Please let us know if you would prefer to receive the homework on paper.

How you can help at home:

- Listen to your child read and ask questions to check their understanding of a text.
- Practise key spellings and times tables as well as the associated division facts.
- Edit written homework before submitting, trying to correct spellings and/or grammar as well as making 3 improvements.

Maths - Place value of numbers up to 10 million including decimals, multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000, properties of numbers, the four operations, introduction to fractions

Science - Exploring different properties of materials, reversible and irreversible changes, scientific working
